Support Branch Manager


I get bored and am always looking for the next challenge so change is the key for me when it comes to work and that is what People's Choice keeps providing me.

Something I learned from that experience is that it's okay to feel overwhelmed sometimes. It's normal and it helps to stay positive.


When I returned to Australia I decided I wanted a change. I was a member of People's Choice and I'd always thought it would be a good place to work - and I was right!
